Buford Saw At
Gettysburg**

The Adams County Historical Society, in conjunction with the Seminary Ridge Historic Preservation Foundation, again presents a visit to the famed cupola, an observation point used by Union General John Buford and the Union Signal Corps on July 1, 1863, and a special tour of Schmucker Hall (Old Dorm).

“As early as seven A.M. I reported their [Confederate] advance, and took my station in the steeple [cupola] of the ‘Theological Seminary.’” LT Aaron B. Jerome October 18, 1865

Tour includes: (Approximately 1 hour)

- **Trip to the Cupola***
- Brief overview and description of the Seminary and fighting on July 1, 1863
- Historical background on the building as a field hospital
- Special viewing of rare and signature artifacts related to the Civil War in the collections of the Adams County Historical Society
- Guided tour of the Civil War Exhibit Gallery
